








Shawn VanDeWater:

Luke is Current Affairs Director for Mobile Baykeeper, working in policy and regulations. An Attorney by training, Luke arrived at Baykeeper in 2024 following a decade of work as a political staffer in various roles. He enjoys applying his experience toward the mission of providing cleaner water.

He repurposes discarded and found objects into sculptures that typically depict animals in action poses and humans playing sports. 
August 17 Everyday Law

John Sledge is one of the authors of the recent book "Mobile and Havana: sisters across the Gulf." He will provide an overview of the long linkage between two most exotic cities. It should be a rich visual, immersive experience into both the history and the architectural heritage of these two places.

John is currently Maritime historian-in-residence at the National Maritime Museum of the Gulf. He retired as a senior architectural historian with the Mobile Historic Development Commission in 2024. He was a newspaper Book Page editor for the *Mobile Press-Register* and is a National Book Critics Circle member. He has published many books about the Gulf Coast region and its history.
